Site investigations on the cycle and pedestrian pathway along Airport Drive from Tuesday 16 July



Sydney Gateway will provide a new alternative route to enhance connections and reduce travel times to Sydney's ports.

We will be drilling boreholes in the ground to test the soil conditions at multiple locations on the cycle and pedestrian pathway along Airport Drive, from Tuesday 16 July for up to four weeks.

This work will provide us with important information on the environmental conditions as part of the proposed Sydney Gateway project.

Our work area, and an example of the cyclist and pedestrian management in place, is shown on the map over the page.

Our work schedule

Work hours will be:

- **Monday to Friday, between 8pm and 5am**

We will work at night to minimise traffic impact and for the safety of our workers, motorists and the public.
